## **RESOLUTION 3-02**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE LAKE SHASTINA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT TO SUPPORT IN WRITING THE BUILDING OF THE WEED COMMUNITY CENTER, SCHEDULED TO BE BUILT THE SUMMER OF 2002, ADJACENT TO THE COLLEGE OF THE SISKIYOUS COLLEGE CAMPUS TO BE USED BY WEED AND NEARBY COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS, the Weed Community Center would provide year round civic, social, educational and recreational activities for people of all ages; and

**WHEREAS**, the majority of the Weed Community has shown a willingness to provide financial support for the center through the two ballot measures: and

WHEREAS, the major construction, furnishing and outfitting of the Weed Community Center will be funded by non-profit foundation grants in which this Resolution will be included in a packet to be mailed on November 1, 2002 and presented to the Ford Family of Directors at a scheduled meeting; and

WHEREAS, the operations of the Weed Community Center will be funded by a combination of center rental, program & user fees, and grant funding. This would include facility anchors and established partners with local business and organizations: and

WHEREAS, the Weed Community Center Board has identified potential partners in Siskiyou County; and

WHEREAS, the Bel-Air Park site is available at no cost near the College of the Siskiyous; and

WHEREAS, the site is already managed by the Weed Recreation and Parks District and is adjacent to the city swimming pool, tennis courts, ball part and children's play area; and

WHEREAS, the facility would provide a safe environment for enhanced youth activities; and

WHEREAS, The Weed Community Center would provide new opportunities to attract large organizations and associations (200-500) that benefit the City of Weed and Siskiyou County; and

**WHEREAS,** The Weed Community Center would provide economics benefits, such as increase in TOT, sales tax, job creation and business growth to the City of Weed and Siskiyou County.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED THAT,** The Lake Shastina Community Services District Board of Directors solemnly support the building of the Weed Community Center in which this Resolution will be included with other local organization resolutions and submitted for grant funding.
